NORTH CAROLINA SAFER SYRINGE INITIATIVE



As of July 11, 2016, North Carolina law (G.S. 90-113.27) allows for the legal establishment of hypodermic syringe and needle services programs. Since legalization, syringe services programs (SSPs) across the state have provided lifesaving support to North Carolinians. These are some of the successes todate based on the objectives stated in the law.


